**Directions to the Pines Community Center
61 Summer Street Northfield, NH**

Northfield is located approximately 17 miles north of
Concord

Coming north on Rte 93 take Exit 19, take a left at the
end of the off ramp, go under Rte 93, and take your first
right - this is Summer Street

Coming southbound on Rte 93, take exit 20
Turn right at the end of the off ramp and follow Rte 3
into Tilton.

Take a left (at the light) onto Rte 132/Park street.
Follow Rte 132 approximately ¼ mile. Take a left onto
Dearborn Street. The community center is on the right
just after the Northfield Police Department.

**Directions to the State Forest Nursery
405 Daniel Webster Highway, Boscawen, NH**

Take Exit 17 off Rte 93 and head toward Boscawen (right
at end of ramp). Follow Rte 3 North for approximately 8
miles. The Nursery is on the left side of the road.

Vernal Pools and Wetland Wildlife

Come and learn about who uses a variety of wetland habitats in New Hampshire. Extension Wildlife Specialist Matt Tarr will talk about the wildlife species that use vernal pools, marshes and shrub-wetland habitats. We will also talk about how to minimize impacts to wetlands when managing forest lands nearby.

Building Trails on Your Tree Farm

Join Hal Graham, NH Trailwrights and Bob Spoerl, Land manager for NH Division of Forests and Lands and a member of NH Trailwrights, as they talk about what is need for proper trail maintenance on your lands. We will learn about how to install and maintain water bars, brook crossing devices and trail markings on trails, as well as other aspects of trail construction. There will be time allotted for questions on trail building and use as well as funding that may be available to assist you in the cost of constructing trails.

How Do Your Logs Saw Out – Where is the Value?

What happens when your wood gets to a sawmill – how does the lumber saw out? Join us at the State Forest Nursery as we saw some logs and look at the boards we generate. Join Sarah Smith UNH Cooperative Extension Forest Industry Specialist and Peter Drouin who will bring his portable sawmill to saw out logs and see what the lumber looks like.
